Mrs. Palmer's Homeroom Fourth Grade News October 4, 2019


Dear Parents,

<u>Homework</u>

Again, please assist your child nightly in making sure that homework is complete and put back into their Yellow Folder and into their book bag. Some students are struggling in this area. Everyone should be in a good routine by now.

Spelling

Some students are having a difficult time getting homework turned in on time for the 2-sided sheet and cursive. Please assist your child to make sure that this is completed and turned in on time.

<u>Language</u>

Students have been working on a big writing piece called, "A Small Moment In Time" where they wrote a Personal Narrative about a special time in their lives. This took a while to complete, but we finally finished this week.

Along with our writing piece, we have been working on using "and" as well as other "conjunctions" in our sentence work. My hope is that students will continue to apply these skills within their writing.

Students began paragraph writing on a single topic this week for a quick writing piece and are continuing the same method used in 3rd grade in which they folded a sheet of blank, white paper in order to create a graphic organizer. We will use this method throughout the year in order to prepare for the AIR Test in the Spring where students will have to learn to organize their thoughts without a premade graphic organizer.



Students are given the opportunity to read for 20 minutes 5 nights a week and fill out their Book It Calendar each month. Students that read each month receive a pizza coupon for Pizza Hut. Any student that has read every month through March will receive a special treat and gift from Mrs. Palmer. I would love to have our whole class participate!

Reading

Last week students worked on an Informational Text in our *Journeys* Book called, <u>My Librarian Is A Camel</u>. Students learned the various ways that children throughout the world get books. We focused on the specific country, how they get the books and why children get their books this way. Students were able to choose their groups to work in and created a slideshow presentation on their specific country of choice. Although students did fairly well on this task, they need to make some improvements in learning how to communicate as a team more efficiently. They did well for their first time this year though!

We read a tall tale called <u>Stormalong</u> this week. Students enjoyed talking about hyperboles from the story and examples that we use often in our daily lives. We discussed character traits and dictionary skills.

Next week we hope to focus on creating our own tall tales using the characters of Stormalong and Paul Bunyan. This will be an exciting adventure for us so we will probably not have a test at the end of the week. We will focus on vocabulary and writing quality stories.



Sylvania Historical Trip

We are scheduled for our first field trip to the Sylvania Historical Village on Main Street in Sylvania on Monday, October 7th. It will be an all day event. You should have seen the information arrive home, but I just thought I'd give you a friendly reminder in case any parents wanted to take the day off work to join the 4th Grade.

Parents if you would like to come along for this trip it is a very enjoyable day! Students will dress up in Pioneer attire and you may as well if you wish. We remain as a whole class on this day, so you would not be in charge of your own group of students.

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
